**Education-** *Emily LoSavio, Opportunity Impact*

- Maintain funding a K to college continuum of education support services in the Fillmore for low income youth that target both academic and personal outcomes; many of these services would be lost if DCYF add-back funding is not maintained.

**Workforce-** *Kemi Role, Women's Community Clinic & Dawud Abdul-Haqq, Western Addition One Stop Center, Goodwill*

- Maintain funding for workforce development programs, particularly for ages 19-24 that are highly structured; provide barrier removal, pre-training, and life skills support; and honor the resilience and experiences of youth in the community.
- The Mayor and Supervisor, in conjunction with city departments and service providers, create a partnership with the private sector to support youth jobs, either by providing employment or contributing funds.

**Family Support Services-** *Cesnae Crawford, Western Addition Family Resource Center Urban Services YMCA & Steve Nakajo, Kimochi, Inc.*

Maintain funding for services to low-income families in the Western Addition, in particular:

- Increase subsidized childcare and Head Start slots for the neighborhood.
- Maintain funding for services to low-income seniors in the neighborhood.

**Youth Services-** *Rodney Chin, Buchanan YMCA & Sheryl Davis, Mo'Magic*

- Maintain funding for youth services and summer employment.
- Prioritize youth employment - subsidized employment, private public partnership and opportunities for stipends.
- Prioritize youth programming - enrichment and activities that keep youth engaged especially during the out of school time, it is a matter of public safety and preparing for the future.
