NOTES: San Francisco's rental assistance program can cover rent for up to 6 months for the months of April 2021 onward, but is being prioritized for certain populations. If your landlord attempts to evict you despite these protections, Open Door Legal can defend you. If you are served with a summons and complaint, you should seek out help immediately, as you only have 5 business days to file an answer.

WHAT: Free emergency ride home for employees 18 and older who work in San Francisco

WHERE: From Work to your vehicle or home

WHEN: Reimbursements must be submitted within 30 days of receiving a ride home. Save your receipts!

NOTES: Can only be used for qualifying emergencies, max of 4 trips per fiscal year and up to \$150 per trip. Rides must be provided by an official taxi or thru public transportation; UBER and Lyft are not reimbursable. Emergency-related side trips on the way home are permitted, including picking up a sick child at school or daycare, filling a prescription at a pharmacy, or stopping at an ATM for cash to pay the taxi driver.

Must also meet ONE of the following criteria: employer does not pay you for jury service, employer does not pay for the estimated duration of jury service, you are self-employed, or you are unemployed.
