During his career, he has worked with adults and adolescents, including youth who have run away from difficult homes, families, people court mandated to treatment, and people convicted of violent crimes. Maurice is also a Certified Anger Management Facilitator. He teaches and consults with both clinical non-clinical staff at several non-profit agencies around the Bay Area and specializes in teaching harm reduction groups.
