Most Internship placements will be six weeks in length, June 17, 2024, to July 26, 2024, for up to 20 hours per week, in person. Please note that some opportunities may be outside of these dates, or require weekend and/or evening work. Interns under 18 will NEED to get their work permit done BEFORE school year ends, failure to bring work permit will prolong the onboarding

process. Once school closes for the summer, interns will need to obtain their work permit from SFUSD work permits office. **Fellows:** An OFA Fellow is a young adult who has graduated from high school or obtained their GED, and is an undergraduate student, postgraduate student or has related work experience, aged 18 - 25. The Fellow will lead a cohort of up to 60 high school-aged interns.
