Please note that some opportunities may be outside of these dates, or require weekend and/or evening work. Interns under 18 will NEED to get their work permit done BEFORE school year ends, failure to bring work permit will prolong the onboarding process. Once school closes for the summer, interns will need to obtain their work permit from SFUSD work permits office. **Fellows:** An OFA Fellow is a young adult who has graduated from high school or obtained their GED, and is an undergraduate student, postgraduate student or has related work experience, aged 18 - 25. The Fellow will lead a cohort of up to 60 high school-aged interns. This position will require the planning and preparation of a project-based curriculum for their cohort and will be responsible for maintaining attendance records, managing and engaging the intern's in their project, and offering support to their cohort. Fellows will also be required to attend and participate in training sessions, as well as community events, during the summer. This is a supervisory position.
